Dear Secretary Bose:

American Electric Power Generation Resources Inc. (AEPGR) filed its Notice of Intent and Preliminary Application Document (PAD) with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (Commission) for the Racine Project (FERC No. P-2570) on July 2, 2018. Although Section 4.4 of the PAD included a description of the existing project operations, the PAD did not include a discussion of proposed project operations. The purpose of this letter is to convey to the Commission that AEPGR does not propose any changes to project operations.

Additionally, AEPGR is proposing to include in the new license the transmission facilities that were originally licensed as part of the Racine Project. These facilities include the 9 kV generator leads, the 9/69 kV, 50,000 kVA step-up transformer and an approximately 475-foot-long, 69 kV line and appurtenances to connect to the 69 kV, bus at Racine. The 3.5 mile-long, 69 kV double circuit transmission line is considered part of the American Electric Power (AEP) distribution system and is not a primary line pursuant to Section 3(11). As such, AEPGR is not proposing to include the 3.5-mile long double circuit line as part of the Racine Project.
