## Subject: Niagara Hydroelectric Project (FERC No. 2466-034) Filing of Final License Application

Dear Secretary Bose:

Appalachian Power Company (Appalachian or Licensee), a unit of American Electric Power (AEP), is the Licensee, owner, and operator of the run-of-river, 2.4-megawatt Niagara Hydroelectric Project (Project) (Project No. 2466), located on the Roanoke River in Roanoke County, Virginia.

The Project is currently licensed by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission). The Project underwent relicensing in the early 1990s, and the current operating license for the Project expires on February 29, 2024. Accordingly, Appalachian is pursuing a new license for the Project pursuant to the Commission's Integrated Licensing Process (ILP), as described at 18 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 5. In accordance with 18 CFR § 5.17(a), Appalachian is hereby filing the Final License Application (FLA) for the Project.

## <u>Overview</u>

As described in the Updated Study Report (December 6, 2021), one component of the Fish Community Study, the Roanoke Logperch larval drift survey, was unable to be completed during the 2020 or 2021 ILP study seasons. This study activity is expected to be completed in 2022. The results of this study may affect Protection, Mitigation, and Enhancement (PM&E) measures proposed by Appalachian as part of its relicensing proposal or recommendations of resource agencies. Appalachian expects to file a revised Fish Community Study Report as supplemental information to support this FLA, by the end of 2022. Additionally, as requested by the Commission's comments on the DLA, Appalachian is filing available geospatial data from the relicensing studies with FERC with the filing of the FLA.

In accordance with 18 CFR § 5.17(d)(2), Appalachian will publish public notice of the filing of the FLA twice in the *Roanoke Times*, a daily newspaper in circulation in Roanoke, Virginia. The public notices will be published within 14 days of the filing of this FLA (i.e., on or before March 13, 2022).

#### Summary of Measures Proposed in the FLA

The FLA does not propose the development of any new hydroelectric facilities or increased generation capacity but provides for PM&E measures related to aquatic species and habitat, water quality, terrestrial resources, and recreation associated with the Project. Proposals presented by in the FLA reflect careful consideration of available information, the results of studies conducted, and issues specific to the Project. Appalachian believes that the proposed PM&E measures as described in the FLA adequately take into consideration the important power and non-power values of the Project, the diverse interests of stakeholders, and the physical and social context of the Project.

The Applicant is proposing to continue the fundamental operation of the Project and to implement certain resource enhancements, including:

- Continue to operate the Project in a run-of-river mode for the protection of fish and aquatic resources;
- Operate the project with a continuous 30 cfs minimum bypass flow for the protection of water quality and fish and aquatic resources in the bypass reach;

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- Develop and implement a Terrestrial Resources Protection Plan in consultation with USFWS and VDWR;
- Develop and implement a Recreation Management Plan for the Project in consultation with Project stakeholders, including enhancements to the existing canoe portage take-out and trail.

Appalachian looks forward to continuing to work with FERC and relicensing participants through the last phase of the ILP and toward the timely issuance of a new license for the Project.
